## WILL OF MARY PERIM OF AMESBURY 1709/10 — proved 23rd June 1712

In the name of God Amen I Mary Perim of Amsbury Late of Allington in the County of Wilts widow being in a good mesure of health and memory Blesed by God but for mortalitys sake do make my Last will and testament in maner and forme following that is to say First I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Allmity God hoping and trusting in him alone for mercy and Eternal Life thro the merrit and mediasion of the Lord Jesus Crist ~ and my body in hope of a joyful resurecsion at the Last Day I comit to the Earth to be buried at the discesion of my Executors and as for my worldly goods I thus dispose of *It.* I give my four children that is to say my Son Marmaduk Perim ~ and Gilbert Perin my Son ~ and my Dauthr An Bishop of Amsbury and Joane the wife of John Blake of Porton twenty Shillings a peece to be payd within twelve month after my Decease *It.* I give to my Granddaughter Elezabeth Butler twenty pond and my aparel and Such houshold goods as I dy posst of Exsept a Bed which is my Son Gilberts ~ which mony shal be payd her at the age of 24 and not before *It.* I give my Grandauter Mary Butler the sum of five pound to be payd her at the same age *It.* I give my Grandson Richard Perrin the Sum of three pound *It.* I give to al my Grand Children five shillings a peece that is to say Mary and Ann and Guilbert and Dukey Perin Children of Gilbert Perring ~ and John the Son of John Butler five pound at the age of 24 ye and William and Marthew the Children of William Blake five Shillings a peece and do make my two Sones Marmaduk Perin and Gilbert Pering my Executors and Trustees to see this my Last wil executed and in testimony here of I have set my hand and Seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of Febarary in the year of our Lord -- 1709<sup>10</sup> *Pay Elizabeth Butler twenty pounds presonaly which upon Second consideration I Desire to be Done*

## WILL OF JOHN PERREN OF NEW SARUM 1837 proved 21st February 1838

I make the following requests of my friend Mr. Winzar On the Evening of Saturday Oct 28th. That I be buried in the Church yard at Downton where all my kindred lie. That Messrs. Beacher, Parker, Eastman, P. Moore, S. Moore, and Grace be the Bearers. That Mr. Adams be respectfully requested to attend and superintend the funeral. That the shell be stout and pitched throughout and filled up with dry saw dust, and a stout coffin covered with black cloth. That I may not be kept many days after death. That Messrs. Beacher & Parker be paid 3/6 each as a remuneration for the loss of a day's work. Mr. Barry has consented to the loan of his cart to convey my body to the King's Arms near the Church, where it will be drawn in, to wait the appointed time to meet the clergyman at the Church Hatch, the bearers to be refreshed at the King's Arms. That the Bearers return to my house and be refreshed before they separate. That the Church fees be paid by Mr. Adams. I wish that the Bearers each have a pair of gloves. Mrs. Hamilton and Mrs. Cobden to have each a pair of Gloves and a Bonnet with a small silk Hankf.

Mrs. Perren to have the bed, bedding and furniture, the night table, 4 blue chairs, round mahogany table, small oval teatray, tea cups and saucers, cups, silver table and tea spoons. A tidy coffin the colour of the wood to be provided at her decease. Dated Nov. 14th 1837 (signed) John Perren

## PARISH REGISTER ENTRIES — WILTSHIRE

### ALLINGTON BY AMESBURY

The Phillimore Marriage Register Index states that the earliest Register of Marriages now in existence here begins with an entry dated 11th April 1664; although this volume has the date 1598 on the cover, there are no Marriages recorded during the first sixty-six years. In the Diocesan Registry there are a few Bishop's Transcripts, and seven Marriages of 1623 to 1636 extracted from them are given here. The Transcripts of 1608, 1622, 1624, 1625, 1627, 1628, 1629, 1635, and 1637 contain no records of Marriage. The first volume ends with 1750 and the next begins in 1755.

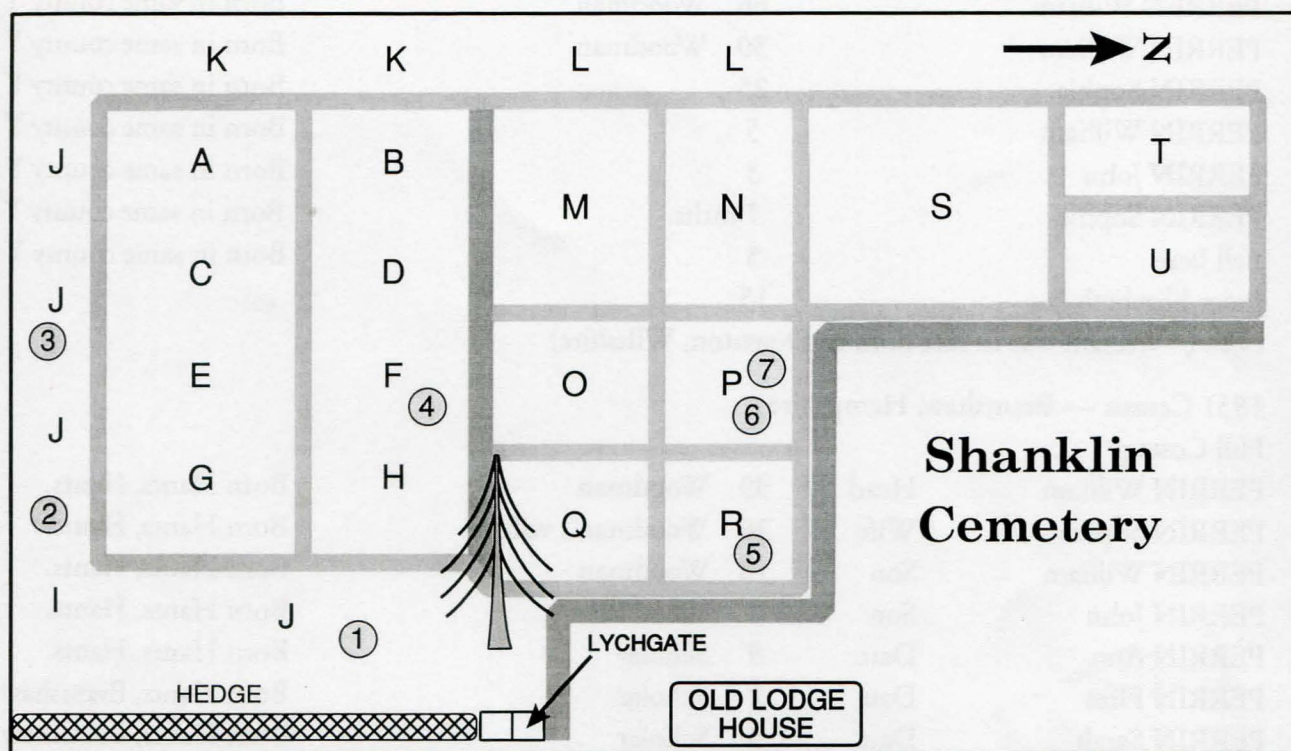

The farm and dairy produce has in consequence improved in quality and increased in quantity and the result is seen in expanding exports of meats, grain, flour, butter, cheese, eggs and fruits, all of which are now becoming well-known to the British markets. There are millions of acres of land still awaiting occupation and cultivation, destined to provide houses for large numbers of people in future. Full particulars may be obtained on application to the High Commission for Canada, 17 Victoria Street, London S.W. It is not only agriculture that has developed in a gratifying manner in Canada. The same remark applies to its great wealth in timber, its fisheries, its manufacturers, and especially to its mineral resources. All are showing great signs of progress and afford excellent opportunities for the investment of capital and the employment of labour.

## BANNISTER FAMILY

### GEORGE HENRY BANNISTER

George Henry Bannister was born in Godshill, Isle of Wight, in 1840. The family lived in Ventnor, Isle of Wight, and George worked as an agricultural labourer before his marriage, as did his father.

He married in Tring, Hertfordshire in 1864. His wife, Ellen Fanny Fenn had been born in Aldbury, Hertfordshire, close to Tring, in 1842 (her name at birth was registered as Helen, and she appeared as Helen on the 1851 Census, but thereafter was known as Ellen). The Aldbury 1851 Census lists the occupation of her older brother and sister as straw plaiter. The 1861 Census for Great Berkhamstead gives Ellen's occupation, aged 19, as one of 3 servants working for a surgeon and his family.

George continued to live at various locations in Ventnor for the rest of his life. His occupation is listed on Census documents for Ventnor as stonemason 1871 / builder 1881 / builder & contractor 1891 / mason 1901 / and stonemason 1911. George and Ellen had four children — Mary Lucy born 1867, William Henry born 1869, Thomas George born 1874, and Albert Francis born 1876.

By the 1901 Ventnor Census, when George is listed as running his own mason business, all his children had left home, and his wife Ellen was listed as lodging house keeper, with two lodgers listed, and a servant. On the 1911 Ventnor Census, he and his wife are listed, together with their widowed eldest daughter Mary Lucy Bulley, and her two children Kenneth Leslie Northcote Bulley, and Ernest Northcote Bulley who had been born in South Africa.

George Henry died in 1915. His wife Ellen died on 5th August 1916 — her will gives the address as 10 Pier Street, Ventnor: Administration to Albert Francis Bannister, Private HM Forces, Effects £26 16s 8d. Albert Francis was the only one of their children still living in England, the other three having emigrated, Mary Lucy to South Africa, with William Henry and Thomas George having emigrated to Canada.

### MARY LUCY BANNISTER

Mary Lucy was born in 1867 in Ventnor. Aged 23, she was still living with her parents at Steephill Farm in 1891 but no occupation is listed.

Mary Lucy Bannister emigrated to South Africa, and married John Northey Bulley [see Bulley family notes for further information] on the 12th January 1892 in Berea, a suburb of Durban, in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa.

They are known to have had four children, John Redvers born in 1892 in Durban, Richard Henry born 1894 in Durban, Kenneth Leslie Northcote born 1901 in Durban, and Ernest Northcote Bulley born in Estcourt in 1905. Estcourt is a town 100 miles north of Durban. John Northey presumably worked at Estcourt Government School, which had been established in 1886, and in accordance with the prevailing colonial policy, the school only admitted pupils of European descent. In 1899, when Churchill arrived at Estcourt as a war correspondent, he described the town as "a South African town — that is to say, it is a collection of about three hundred detached stone or corrugated iron houses, nearly all one-storied, arranged along two broad streets".

Mary Lucy's husband died on the 23rd June 1904 in Estcourt. She returned to England, and the 1911 Census for Ventnor, Isle of Wight, shows Mary Lucy Bulley, and her two youngest children Kenneth Leslie Northcote Bulley aged 10, and Ernest Northcote Bulley aged 6, living with her parents.

It is thought that Mary Lucy returned to South Africa where her two eldest sons were living.

## WILLIAM HENRY BANNISTER

William Henry was born in 1869 in Ventnor, Isle of Wight. He married Rosa Ann (also known as Rose Ann) née Lale, born 1869. They had five children: Ellen May born 1890, Northy William born 1892, Cecil born 1901, Harold Leslie born 1904, and Edith Muriel born 1907. They continued to live in Ventnor, and the 1901 Census lists him as bricklayer & mason. The 1911 Census lists him as a mason.

He emigrated to Canada with his wife, and their three youngest children in April 1913, on the steamship 'Cymric', travelling 3rd class from Liverpool to Portland [Maine], a voyage of 11 days. William's occupation on the Ship's Passenger List is farm labourer.

Rosa Ann died in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan in 1915, and the four youngest children went to live with their elder sister Ellen May, now married, in Winnipeg.

William Henry is shown on the 1916 Canadian Census for Prince Albert, as a widower, living on his own, working as a labourer in a flour mill. Prince Albert is the third largest city in Saskatchewan, Canada, situated on the banks of the North Saskatchewan River.

William's daughter, **Ellen May**, known as May, aged 19, had emigrated, on her own, in July 1910, on the steamship 'Canada', a voyage of 8 days, from Liverpool to Quebec, with her occupation listed as domestic. She went to live with her uncle Thomas George Bannister and his wife in Winnipeg.

May married in Winnipeg on the 15th July 1914, and husband was Alfred Campbell, a salesman at a grocers, who had emigrated to Canada from England in 1907. The 1916 Canadian Census for Winnipeg shows Alfred and May Campbell, and May's 4 brothers and sisters — Northey aged 23 (a postman), Cecil aged 15 (a soldier), Harold aged 12, and Edith aged 9. Alfred and May's son, Jack Campbell, was born in Winnipeg in 1916. The 1921 Canadian Census for Winnipeg shows that May's two youngest siblings are still living with them — **Harold** aged 15 working at a grocers, and **Edith** aged 16, a student.

William's son **Northy William** (usually known as William) had emigrated in 1909, and is listed under Canadian Soldiers of the First World War as having served from 1915–1919. He is shown on the 1921 Canadian Census for Prince Albert, aged 29, working as a Letter Carrier, together with his younger brother **Cecil**, aged 21, who was working as a Filing Clerk.

William Henry Bannister died in Prince Albert in 1937.

## THOMAS GEORGE BANNISTER

Thomas George Bannister was born in 1874 in Ventnor, Isle of Wight. He married Nellie Perren in 1900 in Shanklin. The 1901 Census shows him working as a manager at the store in Bonchurch Village, near Ventnor [this store still exists in 2017]. They emigrated to Canada in 1904, and their daughter Eva Blanche was born on the 7th September 1905 in Quebec.

Thomas George and his family moved to Winnipeg, and he worked as a clerk at two different grocers there until retirement, and died in 1969. Their niece, Ellen May (known as May) emigrated in 1910, and lived with Thomas and Nellie until her marriage.

Their daughter **Eva Blanche** married Nelson Everett Gray on the 12th July 1930 in Winnipeg.

Nelson was born on the 22nd December 1902 in Quebec, the eldest of seven children born to William Charles Everett Gray and his wife Hannah née Kelly. On the 1916 Census for Winnipeg, Nelson is aged 14, his father listed as a Traveller. The Gray family are listed on the 1921 Census for Edmonton, Alberta, and Nelson is listed aged 19 working as a Manager for an Auto Livery firm.

Family photographs indicate that Eva and Nelson had three children, Leona, Marilyn, and a boy (Mick or Nick). Voters Lists for West 28th Avenue, Vancouver, British Columbia, list Nelson and Eva, from

1945 and they remained at this address until their deaths — Nelson was a Buyer in 1945, a Manager in 1953, and the 1962 Voters List gives Nelson's occupation as Merchandise Manager. Eva died on the 24th June 1993 and was buried in the Cemetery Gardens of Gethsemani, Vancouver. Nelson died on the 25th April 1999 in Vancouver.

## ALBERT FRANCIS BANNISTER

Albert Francis Bannister was baptised on the 28th May 1876 in Ventnor, Isle of Wight. He married Eliza Dale at the Kensington Register Office in London in 1897.

They had five children, all born in Ventnor — Francis George born 1898, Albert William born 1900, Ellen Maude born 1902, Violet born 1904, and Thomas Kenneth born 1906. On the 1911 Ventnor Census, the family were living at No. 1 Waterworks Cottages, and Albert's occupation is listed as mason.

In the First World War, he served in the Royal Garrison Artillery from 1915 — Reg. nos. 132863, 341434, and 107809, described as being 39 years old, occupation mason, height 5ft 9¼ ins.

Albert Francis died on the Isle of Wight in 1934 aged 57. His wife Eliza died on the Isle of Wight in 1960 aged 90.



## BULLEY FAMILY

**JOHN RICHARD BULLEY** was born in 1835 in Exeter. He became a schoolmaster and was married in 1862 at Week St. Mary in Cornwall, to Jane Rowe, born 1836 in Boyton, Cornwall.

The 1871 Census for St Thomas, Devon (connected to Exeter by the Exe Bridge) lists John Richard as National School Master. The family now had four children — John Northey born 1863, William Southcott born 1865, Richard Ernest born 1867, and Harriet Ethel born 1869. Also living with them was his sister-in-law Mary Rowe, aged 23, National School Mistress.

The family had moved to the Isle of Wight by 1881 and the Wroxall Census shows that John Richard was schoolmaster at Wroxall Board School, and his wife was schoolmistress at the same school. John Northey, aged 18, is shown there as Pupil-Teacher.

John Richard's wife, Jane, died in the Isle of Wight in 1887 aged 48.

On the 6th June 1890, John Richard aged 55, and his son John Northey emigrated from Southampton to Natal, South Africa on board the steamship 'German', a voyage of 65 days. The Ship's Passenger List gives his occupation as schoolmaster, and that of his son as Bookbinder.

He was a witness at the marriage of his son John Northey in 1892 in Durban, South Africa.

**JOHN NORTHEY BULLEY** was born at Brendon Hills, Somerset, on the 27th March 1863, and was baptised on the 24th May 1863 at Treborough, Somerset (Treborough is a small village 7 miles south of Dunster, lying amongst the Brendon Hills within the area now known as the Exmoor National Park), the son of John Richard Bulley, schoolmaster, and his wife Jane.

On the 6th June 1890, John Northey emigrated to South Africa with his father.

John Northey Bulley married Mary Lucy Bannister [see Bannister family notes for further information] on the 12th January 1892 at the Presbyterian Church in Berea, a suburb of Durban. John Northey is described as a Teacher, full age, living in Durban, with his wife being also of full age and living in Durban. His father John Richard Bulley was one of the marriage witnesses.

They are known to have had four children, John Redvers born in 1892 in Durban, Richard Henry born 1894 in Durban, Kenneth Leslie Northcote born 1901 in Durban, and Ernest Northcote Bulley born in Estcourt in 1905. Estcourt is a town 100 miles north of Durban. John Northey presumably worked at Estcourt Government School, which had been established in 1886, and in accordance with the prevailing colonial policy, the school only admitted pupils of European descent. In 1899, when Churchill arrived at Estcourt as a war correspondent, he described the town as "a South African town — that is to say, it is a collection of about three hundred detached stone or corrugated iron houses, nearly all one-storied, arranged along two broad streets".

The Ship's Passenger List for the steamship 'Umbilo' lists John Northey, his wife, and three children returning to Port Natal, South Africa from London, on the 7th October 1903, a voyage of 40 days.

John Northey Bulley died on the 23rd June 1904 in Estcourt.

His son **John Redvers Bulley** was born in 1892 in Durban, and was buried in Estcourt in 1978. His wife Irene born in 1894 was buried in Estcourt in 1974, and their daughter Mary Fenn Bulley, described as of Willow Grange, was buried in Estcourt aged 3 years in 1924.

His son **Richard Henry Bulley** was born on the 13th November 1894 in Lowlands, South Africa. He married Lilius Amelia Mattison on the 20th December 1922 in Estcourt, and died on the 2nd April 1958 aged 63. He had three children, one of whom was named Lewis Northcote Bulley (born 1924 in Estcourt, and died 27th June 2005 in Estcourt).

From Ship Passenger Lists, we learn that his son **Kenneth Leslie Northcote Bulley** was a Civil Servant and went to live in Kenya. On the 28th June 1935 he departed from Southampton with his wife Evangelina and their 3 sons R. Bulley aged 8, M. Bulley aged 7 and N. Bulley aged 5, on board the 'Arndale Castle' travelling back to Natal. Kenneth was aged 34 a Civil Servant, his wife was aged 32. Their country of intended future permanent residence was Kenya. On the 2nd June 1939, on board the 'Windsor Castle' travelling from Durban to Southampton, Kenneth is listed as aged 38, civil servant, with Evangeline and their son Nigel, and a month later on the 6th July 1939, the three passengers are shown on board the 'Llanstephan Castle' travelling to Mombasa, Kenya.

**WILLIAM SOUTHCOTT BULLEY** born 1865 in Brendon Hills, Somerset, and baptised 17 July 1865 at Leighland Chapel, a hamlet in the area now known as the Exmoor National Park, Somerset, England. His parents were John Bulley, Schoolmaster, and Jane Bulley. He is shown, aged 6, on the 1871 Census for St. Thomas, Devon with his family, and again on the 1881 Census for Wroxall, Isle of Wight, aged 16 a Monitor at Wroxall Board School where his parents were schoolmaster and schoolmistress.

**RICHARD ERNEST BULLEY** born 1867 in St. Thomas Devon, also emigrated to South Africa. On the 25th December 1897, at the residence of the bride's parents, he married Christine Gordon Moir Argo with the service administered by the minister of the Presbyterian Church in Berea, a suburb of Durban.

The Ship's Passenger List for 13th April 1921 shows that he travelled from Cape Town to London on board the steamship 'Dunluce Castle', a voyage of 22 days. Richard Ernest is listed with a Mr C.R. Bulley, travelling 3rd class, with their destination being Wroxall, Isle of Wight. They returned to Natal from London on the 16th June 1921, again 3rd class on board the 'Dunluce Castle' with Richard Ernest described as aged 52 and a schoolmaster, and Mr C.R. Bulley listed as aged 21. The Ship's Passenger List for the 'SS Watussi' which departed on the 19th November 1933 from Southampton, shows Richard Bulley aged 67, his wife Christina aged 55, and Agnes Bulley aged 30, all travelling 1st class back to Durban.

**HARRIET ETHEL BULLEY** born 1869 in St. Thomas, Devon, and died in 1872 aged 3.

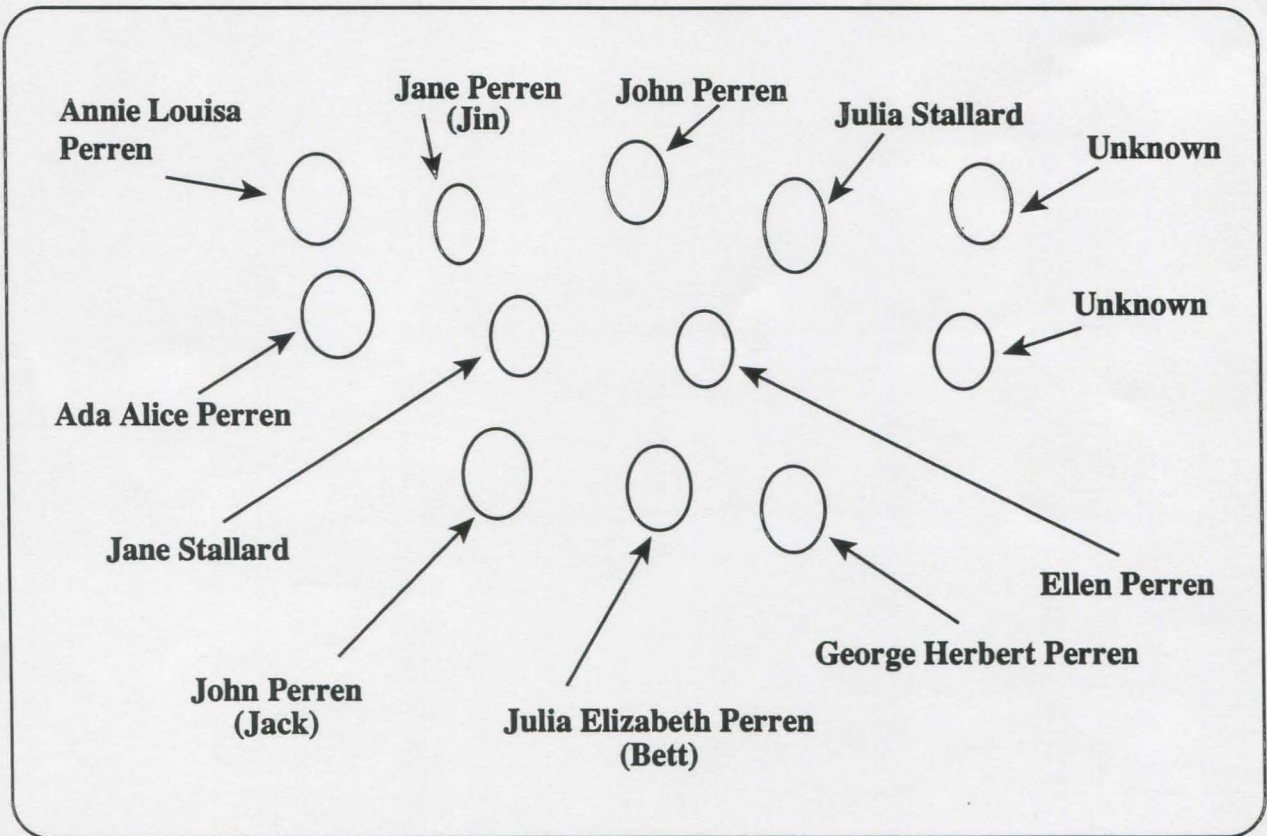

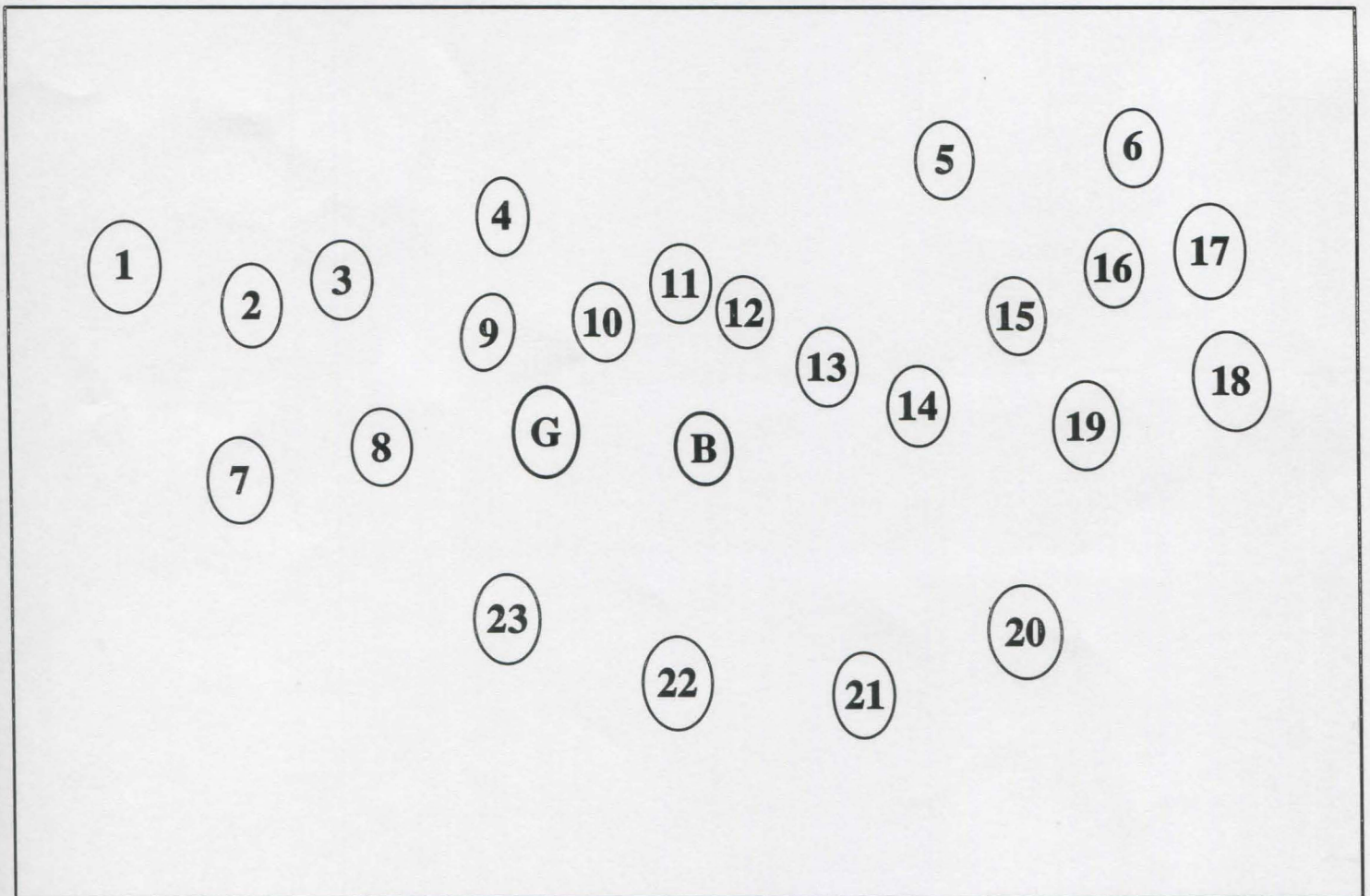
