## Transcription of Will — JOHN STALLARD 1632 NEWPORT

Winchester Record Office 1632 B 51/1-2

In the name of God amen the twentieth day of June in the seaventh year of the Raigne of our sovereigne Lord Charles by the grace of god King of England Scotland Ireland and France defender of the faith Anno dmni 1631 I John Stallard of Newport Isle of Wight and County of South. Baker being whole in body and of good and perfect mind and memory praised be god therefore Doo ordayne and make this my last will and testament in manner and forme following And First I do bequeath my soule unto the handes of god the father who created me of nothing and of his sonne Jesus Christe my lord and saviour who by his precious blood shed upon the cross hath redeemed me both body and soule out of the hands of the devil and god of the holy ghost my sanctifier and the giver of all goodness being (in trinity three persons but in unitie) one invisible immortal and only wise god to whome be praise glory power dominion and thanks for all his mercyes bestowed uppon me both now and forevermore Amen SECONDLY I commend my body to the earth whereof it was first framed to be buried in decent and christian buriall in the normall place of buriall for the dead of and belonging to the burrough of Newport aforesaid commonly called Cossam there to remayne untyll the second coming of our lord Jesus Christ by whome stedfastly believe I shallbe raised uppe againe at the last day and enter with him into that ymortall glory which is prepared for all those whom this life lay holi uppon him by a true and lyvely faith.

ITEM I give and bequeath unto a Minister for a funerall sermon to be preached by him at by buriall in the Church of Newport aforesaid tenne shillings the same to be paid him by my executor or executrix named presently after the end of the said sermon. ITEM I give and bequeath unto the poor people of the burrough of Newport aforesaid twenty shillings to be ordered and disposed at my funerall at the discretion of executors and creditors hereafter named AND of my worldly substance and temporall state in lands and goods and for the selling and establishing thereof manner and forme following that is to say INPRIMIS I give and bequeath unto my eldest sonne Abraham Stallard all my fee simple lande tenements and hereditaments wth appurtenince which I heretofore purchased to me and my heires for valuable considerations of divers resons situate lying and coming within the Burrough of Newport aforesaid within the same Isle TO HAVE and to hold the same to him and to the heires males of his body lawfully begotten and to be begotten and for defalt of such yssue the remainder thereof unto Thomas Stallard my second sonne TO HAVE and to hold the same to him and the heires males of his body lawfully begotten and to be begotten And for default of such yssue the ramainder thereof unto John Stallard my youngest sonne TO HAVE and to hold the same to him and to the heires males of his body lawfully begotten and to be begotten And for default of such yssue the remainder thereof to the right heires of me the said John Stallard forever AND WHEREAS by Indenture of Lease bearing date the fore and twentieth day of June in the fourteenth year of the raigne of our late sovereign lord James of England and of famous memory deceased and of his rayne of Scotland the nine and fortyteth made between Robert Dillington (then so called) of Knighton in the parish of Bonchurch in the Isle of Wight in the county of South Squire of the one part and me the aforementioned John Stallard by the name of John Stallard of Newport in the said Isle and County Baker of the otherwise I the said John Stallard doo hold and enjoy all the thereafternamed nowhith appurtaining called and knowne by the name of Litle Whitfield situate lying and being within the parish of Bonchurch aforesaid now in the tenure or occupation of John Cricket or his assigned together withall howses barnes buildings stables stawles orchards gardens lande and arable meadow as pastures feeding and comons to the sayd tenement belonging and apptayning or occupied soled occupied to or with the tenement or deemed esteemed

reputed or taken to be as pte peell or member thereof or of any pte thereof except as in the same indenture of lease excepted for by and during the terme of four score and twentione yeares fully to be compleat and ended of the aforementioned Thomas Stallard and John Stallard the second youngest sonnes of me the aforementioned John Stallard theire father or either of them did or shold soe long lyve the same estate to commence and beginne ymmediately from and after the decease of Joane Stallard my [ new? ] wyfe wth Indenture of lease to rest upon the yearely rent of two and twenty shillings of lawful money of England two dayes labor in harvest or twelve pence in money in lieu thereof and one shilling half of six ..... or six shillings of lawful money of England at the choice of the said Robert Dillington and his heires As in and by the said received indenture of lease amongst divers covennts conditions and agreements therein contayned more plainely and atlarge it doth or may appeare NOWE to the intent & purpose that the said recited Indenture of lease and the said tenement and premisses wth thappurtenince thereby demised and lett on and ..... thereof may during the ..... and thereof remayne and be as a stock or portion to and for the .... and behoof of my aforesaid sonnes Thomas Stallard and John Stallard their yssue and for their better e..... lyvelyhood and many sonnse in tyme to come I will and the true intent and meaning of this my prsnt last will and testament is that after the decease of the aforementioned Joane Stallard my wife the aforesaid Abraham Stallard my said eldest sonne shall have hold and enjoy the said recited Indenture of Lease and the said tenement and premises wth thappurtenince thereby demised and granted during all the contynance of the same demise PROVIDED always and on this condition that he the said Abraham Stallard or his assigned during his naturall lyfe and after the decease of the said Abraham his decentor or executors (of the lease and appoint ....more able and sufficient for such purpose) shall sell and truly pay or cause to be paid to the aforesaid Thomas Stallard and John Stallard his brother my said sonnes out of the rents yssues and profitts of the said recited Indenture of Lease and the said tenement and premises with thappurtenince thereby demized the yearly sume of seaven pounds tenne shillings a peece of current english money at two feasts termes withe yearly ..... shall that is to saye at the feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Michaell the Archangell or within forty dayes next after every of the said feasts by even and equall portions the first half yeares payment to be made in and appon that feast or the feasts aforesaid within forty dayes then next following ..... shall first and next happen after the decease of the said Joane my wife and for non payment of the said severall somes of seaven poundes tenne shillings to my said sonnes Thomas and John in manner and forme aforesaid my will and meaning is that either of them not soe paid shall and may enter into and uppon the moyety of one half of the said tenement and premises before recited to be demised and there distraine for the same or otherwise who ha.... to retayne keepe and possesse the same moyetie untill .....he be fully satisfied and the said full some of seaven pounds and ten shillings or soe much thereof as shalbe soe unpaid with the averages thereof (if any happen to be AND the true intent and meaning of this my prsnt last will and testament is that yf either of my said sonnes Thomas or John doo happen to dye during the contynance of the said demise then the whole of fifteen pounds shalbe yearely paid unto that sonne of the two such shall survive and so the yssue of the said deceased sonne lawfully begotten of (if he leave any) by equall portions in such manner and forme and then such condition for recuvery thereof being unpaid as before committed and expressed FURTHERMORE the true intent and meaning of this my prsnt last will and testament is that if in case it soe fall out that my said eldest sonne Abraham Stallard doo happen to dye or depart this life before the terms by the said recited Indenture of Lease ..... be fully ended and determined and in such case shall not leave and appoint such executor or executors as is are or shalbe able and sufficient to pay and discharge the said yearely sum of fifteen pounds in manner and forme aforesaid Then my will and meaning is that William Eame the elder of the parish of Hayden in the County of Dorset husbandman my wyves brother shall have hold and enjoye the said recited

Indenture of Lease and the said tenement and premises wth thappurtenning thereby granted dureing the residue of the terme therein then to come and unexpired to the intent and purpose and on this condition that the said Williame Eame or his assignes doo well and truly paie and discharge the said yearly sum of fifteen pounds according to the true meaning of this my will in such manner and forme as my said eldest sonne Abraham Stallard or his assigned or able & sufficient executor or executors (yf he had left unappointed any such and had lyved the terme by the said Indenture of Lease granted according to the terme of this my will should have done And the true intent and meaning of this my prsnt last will and testament is that yf in case it so fall out that the said Williame Eame the elder doo happen to dye or depart this life before the said residue of the said terme by the said recited indenture of lease granted be fully ended and determined and shall not leave and appoint such an executor or executors and or shall able and sufficient to pay discharge the said yearly sum of fifteen pounds in manner and forme aforesaid then my will and meaning is that my two younger sonnes Thomas Stallard and John Stallard and the survivor of them and their issue lawfully begotten shall ..... have and enjoy the said recited indenture of lease and the premisses thereby ..... and demised and receyve the yearly rents yssues and profitts thereof dureing all the rest and residue of the said terme by the said Indenture of lease granted ITEM I give and bequeath unto my said three sonnes Abraham Stallard Thomas Stallard and John Stallard over and besides the severall legacies bequests and provisiones formerly ordayned given and appointed for them the some of tenne pounds apeece of current English money to be paid unto them within the yeare next after my decease by my executrix hereunder named ALL the rest of my goods and chattels moveable and immoveable of what nature and quality or condition soever the same or any of them are and be not hereinbefore by me geven and bequeathed my debts and legacies being first paid and my funerall expenses discharged I give and bequeath unto the aforementioned Joane my welbeloved wife whome I nominate and appoint to be whole and sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoke all former wills by me made And I doo hereby nominate and appoint to be overseers of this my prsnt last will and testament to see the same duly executed and performed according to my true meaning Robert Newland the younger of the Gastcomes in the parish of Whippingham on the Isle abovesaid merchant and William Eame the younger of Haiden aforesaid in the said county of Dorset husbandman Sonne of the aforementioned William Eame the Elder to each of whome for there paines in this behalf to be taken I geve and bequeath the some of twelve shillings of current English money to be paid to them by executor within two monthes next after my decease IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seale dated the day and yeare first above written.

**Indenture of Lease [1617]**

Dated 24th June in 14th year of reign of James of England, deceased (and 49th year of reign of Scotland).

BETWEEN Robert Dillington (then so called) of Knighton, parish of Bonchurch, Isle of Wight, squire  
AND John Stallard of Newport, baker (testator of 1632 will)

This indenture of lease refers to land called and known by the name of Litle Whitfield lying in the parish of Bonchurch now in tenure or occupation of John Cricket (houses, barns, buildings, stables, orchards, meadows, etc. etc.)

## Transcription of Will — ABRAHAM STALLARD 1638 NEWPORT

In the name of God Amen the twentieth day of September Anno Dom. 1638 I Abraham Stallard of Newport in the Isle of Wight in the Countie of South Baker being sicke in bodie but of sound & perfect minde & memorie (thanks be to god) I do make & ordenie this my last will & testament in manner & forme following First I bequeath my soule unto Almightye God and my bodie to decent Christian buriall Item I give to the Cathedrall Church of Winton twelve pounds And to the church of Newport (if my executors be faithfully dealt with in paying them what I have laid out) as uppon my salvation I have dealt trulie with the church in my example) the some of five pounds Item I humbly request my dearest mother to accept of five pounds y. Accrud to be duellie paid her for the house I dwell in during so long time as my loving wife shall live with her as widdowe in my name Item I give unto my aunt Chedle during her life twentie shillings yearly And to my uncle John Stallard weaver fortie shillings yearly during his life to be payed unto them quarterly by my executors out of my psonnell Estate Item I give to my uncle John Stallard smyth ten shillings to be payed within three months next after my decease & to my Aunt Jane Addams ten shillings to be paid likewise. And to my Brother John Stallard five pounds to be paid within six months next after my decease. And to all the children of my brother Thomas ten shillings be payed. To be paid within three months next after my decease. Item I give to my wife five pounds And to James Strong pps. Item I give unto such Minister as the Mayor of Newport for the time being shall appoint ten shillings yearly during one & twentie years next after my decease to preach uppon Shrove Tuesday at ten of the clock in the morning and due of the same one & twentie years Item I give to Mr. William Herley whome I doo request to preach at my funerall ten shillings And a pulpitt cloth Item I will that if the eight and fiftie poundes due to me from the kings Maty. for Bread be received by my executors that then the poore of Newport shall have Ten pounds thereof & other ten pounds thereof shalbe imployed towards the digging deeper of the haven of Newport being done within three years next after the receipt of thesd l..yt All the residue of my moneys debts goods & chattils not herein bequeathed my debts being paid & funerall charges at the discretion of my overseers discharged I give and bequeath unto my three children provided that if my wife be nowe with child that then the same shud have an equall part so farre forth as any of the rest And I doo make ordeyne & appoint to be Executors of trust of this my will my brother William Maynard, Mr. Robert Mathewes & Henry Ringwood Giving them full power & earnestly desering them to manage and dispose of my childrens estates for their best benefitt during their minority That is to say the male untill the age of one & twenty years & the female untill the same age or marriage and fully to execute this my will in all things according to the true meaning thereof. Provided always & my will is that my said executors out of my estate committed to them shall allowe unto my loving wife sufficient maintenance so long as she shall keepe her selfe in my name Item I give to my said Executors of trust twentie mar. In witness whereof I have caused this my last will & testament to be written & have hereunto sett my hand & seale the daie & year first Above written.

## Transcription of Addendum to Will — ABRAHAM STALLARD 1638 NEWPORT

Winchester Record Office ref. 1638 A173/2

This Are to declare to whome it shall appertaine that I John Billingham being sent for in an evening to come unto Mr. Abraham Stallard to make his Will I went to him and took instructions thereof from him ptly written (as I beleave) by himself with his name therunto and partly by word of his mouth & by me noted hee was verie sicke and said his breath was short and hastened mee. I went home and wrote his will & brought it to him, and Offered to reade it to him but he would not thereof admitt but hastened the sealing of it. I againe advised him to heare it first wich he refused. Then said I lett yr brother Maynard reade it to himself (whoo hearde the Instructions) wherto he agreed and as soone as that was done he againe hastened the sealing of it, and signed sealed and declared it to be his last will & sithence I reading it & comparing it with the said testators Instructions found that by reason of haste, somewhat by my oversight was omitted in writing the will viz 1 That the psp Ammd given toa Preacher for a sermon in Newport yearly on Shrove Tuesday for XX1ty yeares by the said testators Direction was to issue out of his Mill called Townegate Mill 2ly that his brother Maynard & the rest (meaning <as I conceive> his executors of trust) should be Gardian to his children. and his wife to have the keeping of them during her widdowehood and to be allowed by the executors all wch I well remember & I can with a safe conscience depose to be the verie truth. & wille (God assisting) whensoever I shalbe duely called therunto. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto sett my hand this 27th of November Ann. Dni. 1638

“1664 — the first document is a return made by Abraham Stallwood and Francis Searle, constables of Newport:

Abraham Stalwood and Francis Searle, lately constables or tithingmen of Holyrood Street in the borough of Newport in the Isle of Wight are charged because they have failed to account for two shilling in respect of two hearths in the said street and for four shilling in respect of four hearths in St. James Street. The said Abraham Stalwood and Francis Searle also recently constables or tithingmen of High Street in the said Borough are also charged with four shilling in respect of four hearths there. Also (blank) the constables or tithingmen of Brixton in the West Medina in the Isle of Wight are charged because they have failed to account for one shilling in respect of one hearth there.

In his reply Nicholas Sexton stated that: Abraham Stalwood and Francis Searle, constables of Holyrood Street and the constables of Brixton are all within the Isle of Wight and are the responsibility of Mr. Worsley (the Receiver there).“

Hearth Tax was a national tax dating from 1662, and finally abolished in 1689 — it was a very unpopular tax. It was paid by the occupier (or if a house was empty by the owner) at the rate of 2 shillings per hearth in equal instalments at Ladyday (25th March) and Michaelmas (29th December).

A number of people were granted exemptions on the grounds either that they were too poor to pay taxes and rates or that they had a certificate signed by the minister and parish officers to the effect that their premises were worth not more than £1 per annum or that their personal property was worth less than £10 per annum. However, no exemption was allowed anyone possessing more than two hearths. The number of exempted people often amounted to 30–40% of the community, and sometimes even more.

Everyone, however poor, had at least one hearth. The majority of householders had one, two or three hearths. Four or five might indicate a substantial yeoman's farmhouse, roomy but with few modern improvements. Nine or ten signifies a fine house, probably that of a gentleman. At that time the building of many separate rooms with proper fireplaces and chimneys was still a modern innovation except for the very rich. (At the upper end of the scale Hatfield House, built in 1611 by Elizabeth's minister Robert Cecil, had ninety-seven).

### 1859 CHALE

CHALE a large and scattered village, 8½ miles s. of Newport, is picturesquely situated on the southern shore of the Isle of Wight, near the rocky cliffs of Chale bay, and the tremendous chasm called Blackgang Chine, which is already with the other romantic features of this part of the coast. The parish of Chale contains 629 souls and 2254a 3r 27p of land, rising from the high and craggy cliffs to a bold range of Downs, and including Stroud Green, St. Catherines Down, several scattered farmhouses and handsome marine villas, and a large hotel, which is much frequented by families and tourists who flock hither in summer to view the picturesque beauties of the stupendous cliffs, chines, and hills of "the back of the Island". The manors of Chale and Walpen were sold in 1806, to the late Earl of Yarborough; but the soil belongs to many freeholders. St. Catherine's Hill rising from the head of Blackgang Chine to the height of 750 feet above high water mark, commands extensive prospects both of sea and land. On this lofty eminence, a chapel dedicated to St. Catherine was erected on the site of a hermitage, in 1323, by Walter, Lord of the Manor of Godyton. The priest was bound to provide lights in the chapel tower for the safety of vessels passing the dangerous coast. About 1780, the Brethren of the Trinity House built a circular lighthouse near the chapel, but it was found to be of no use, as the

summit of the hill was always obscured by vapours in bad weather. On the northern brow of the hill is an elegant column, 72 feet high, called the Alexandrian Pillar. It was erected by Michael Hay, esq., in remembrance of the visit of the Emperor of Russia to Great Britain in 1814, and of the founder's long and happy residence in Russia. There is a Coast Guard station at St. Catherine's Point, and near Blackgang Chine is the great landslip of 1799. On the romantic cliffs, near the water fall, is the Blackgang Chine hotel, a large and handsome building, commanding extensive marine views, in which the Bill of Portland may be seen in fine weather. Near it are several handsome villas, called Sealand Cottage, Seaview, Rockside, Low Cliff, Southlands, &c; all in truly picturesque situations, sheltered on the north by lofty hills, and commanding delightful prospects of the coast and English Channel. Southlands, the seat of Sir. H.A. Johnson, Bart., was purchased by him in 1858. Low Cliff, the seat of Chevalier D'Andre, was purchased by him in 1859. Both of them are handsome stone mansions, with finely wooded grounds; as also is Sea View, the seat of Thos. Letts, Esq. Chale Abbey Farm belongs to Sir. H.F. Garden, Bart.; and in the walls of the farmhouse are vestiges of an ancient building, supposed to have been a monastery. Chale Church (St. Andrew) is an interesting Norman structure, built in the early part of the 12th century, and having a handsome tower. An ancient stone coffin, dug up in the churchyard some years ago, is now in one of the aisles. Here is a monument in memory of Major General Sir Henry Worsley, K.C.B., who died in 1841. In the churchyard were buried many of the crew and passengers of the ill-fated Clarendon West Indiaman, which was wrecked on this rocky coast in 1836. The rectory, valued at £334, is in the patronage of James Theobald, Esq., of Winchester, and incumbency of the Rev. A.W. Gother, M.A., who has a good rectory house, which was improved in 1835, at the cost of £700. The glebe is 37a 1r 26p. The tithes of the parish has been commuted for £347 5s. to the rector, and £290 15s. 2d. per annum to several impropietors. Here is a small Wesleyan chapel, and Bible Christian meeting room. The parish school was built in 1843 at the cost of about £500 and is endowed with about £15 per annum arising from the interest of £150 left by Robt. Weekes in 1784; the dividends of £357 13s. 8d. three percent consols. purchased with £200 left by John Barber in 1795; and from a rent-charge of £5 left by Rev. Fras. Worsley in 1807. The last named donor also gave a cottage and garden for the free occupation of the schoolmaster. The rent of the parish land 3a 1r 39p is applied with the church rates. The post office is at Abm. Bakers's. Letters via Newport. There are excursion coaches in summer to and from Blackgang Chine Hotel. The daily carriers to Newport are David Cheverton, Jas. Long, Morris and James Raynor and Frank Wheeler,

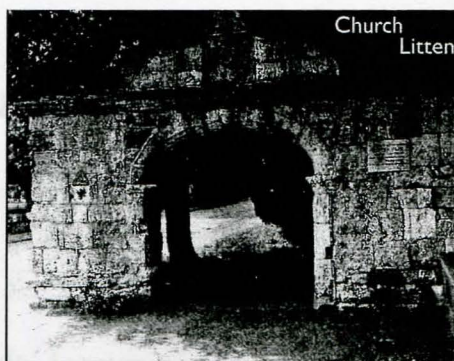
